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Launching of APFNet Alumni Network

In 2019, APFNet is making a great stride by bringing closer ties and communication among Alumni and current students through the launching of APFNet Alumni Network. The mechanism for the creation of Alumni Network was formally introduced during the 1st Asia-Pacific Forestry Youth Forum held on December 8-11, 2019 in Beijing Forestry University which was attended by APFNet alumni and students.

During the forum, Ricmar Magarin, APFNet scholarship student from Beijing Forestry University and also one of the Alumni Relations Assistants presented the strategies on how to successfully build and maintain an active alumni network. The Alumni Network has four main strategies these include: 1) building linkage among alumni; 2) culture of engagement; 3) information sharing; and 4) awards and recognition.

Currently, APFNet scholarship program has 103 alumni across 19 economies across Asia-Pacific region. These alumni acquired master's degree in field of forestry, forestry economics, soil and water conservation, forestry engineering and environmental engineering. After graduated, these alumni continue government agencies, research institutes, international organizations, NGOs and some are pursuing doctorate program.

The Alumni Network is crucial considering that the number of APFNet scholarships has been increasing every year. This will serve as self-governing platform which aims to further enhance knowledge and experience sharing as well as to strengthen communication and coordination between Alumni in promoting regional forestry development and collaboration in the Asia-Pacific region.

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APFNet Scholarship Intakes 2019

The APFNet Scholarship Program was started in 2010 which aims to support capable forestry officials and researchers in the Asia-Pacific region to pursue higher academic degrees in the field of sustainable forest management. The scholarship program is offered in partnership with three leading universities in China such as Beijing Forestry University, Nanjing Forestry University and Northwest Agriculture & Forestry University.

For over a decade, the APFNet Scholarship Program was able to support a total of 159 students from 20 different economies across Asia-Pacific region. Out of these, 63 are female and 96 are male. These students are working in the government agencies, research institutes, international organizations, NGOs and academes in their respective economies. The study program of the APFNet scholarship students are in the field of forest science, forestry economics and management, environmental engineering, forest protection, soil and water conservation and desertification control. For 2019, a total of 34 new students have been awarded with the APFNet Scholarship program and was officially enrolled to the three host universities. It also a monumental for APFNet scholarship since it is the first time that the scholarship program started supporting Ph.D. program students. A total of 29 students are currently taking their master's degree and 5 students under the Ph.D. program. These new students came from the economies of Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nepal, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan.

APFNet just recently inked a cooperation with Chulalongkorn University in Thailand for its scholarship program that will support two students annually. This milestone is a good start to expand the coverage of the scholarship program. Currently, there are two students studying in Chulalongkorn University taking their Master's Degrees under Environment, Development and Sustainability program.

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1st Asia-Pacific Forestry Youth Forum

In December 9-11, 2019, the Asia-Pacific Network for Sustainable Forest Management and Rehabilitation and the School of Economics and Management of Beijing Forestry University organized the 1st Asia-Pacific Forestry Youth Forum which was held in Beijing, China. The forum served as venue for young professionals in the field of forestry to discuss and share ideas on the different key issues with regards to the implementation of sustainable forest management within the Asia-Pacific region. The forum was participated by the APFNet Scholarship students and alumni from Beijing Forestry University, Nanjing Forestry University and Northwest Agriculture & Forestry University.

Several keynote speeches were given by experts on the green development in Asia -Pacific and forest rehabilitation and livelihood projects funded by APFNet in the region. In addition, trends in forest trade with Asia-Pacific economies and new forest plantation experiences from World Wildlife Fund (WWF) China were also presented.

Alumni and student from different economies of Cambodia, China, Malaysia, Mongolia, Nepal, Papua New Guinea, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and Vietnam presented their respective experiences and researches in field of community forestry, forest ecosystem services, wildlife conservation management, and forest protection.

Participants of the forum also took part in panel discussion on the key issues of forest restoration and sustainable management in Asia-Pacific, and how to achieve effective conservation and sustainable development on a global scale. The forum was concluded with participants signifying their intentions to take active participation for the attainment of sustainable development in the region with high hopes that it will be achieved in the future.

Internship in Guangxi Province, China

The APFNet scholarship students from three host universities participated the internship program in Piangxiang, Guangxi, China on November 18-24, 2019. The field study provided the opportunity for the APFNet studies to learn the "Models of Sustainable Forest Practices in Southern China". The internship aimed to provide useful sustainable forestry learning to APFNet scholarship students through series of academic lectures, field visits, as well as the exchange of ideas and experiences among students.

The internship was made possible through the cooperation between APFNet, Experimental Center of Tropical Forestry, Chinese Forestry Academy, Beijing Forestry University, Nanjing Forestry University, and Northwest Agriculture and Forestry University. A total of 50 APFNet scholarship students participated the internship from from 13 different economies of Bangladesh, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Peru, The Philippines, Tajikistan, Thailand, Uzbekistan and Vietnam.

During the internship, series of lectures on forest restoration and rehabilitation experiences in Southern China were discussed by experts focused on the efficient management of planted forests, close-tonature approach, and relevant researches in tropical forest landscape. Also, the students visited experimental centers, demonstration projects, and forest-based industries as well as interacting with different stakeholders.

Another important highlight of the internship was the workshop which gave room for students to discuss on their learning and shed light on the forest management issues

from their respective economies. Forest management issues that were identified by scholarship students include forest fire, illegal logging, forest encroachment, land tenure conflicts, limited man power with lack of technical skills, and weak enforcement on forest laws.

APFNet scholarship students also recommended strategies to address the identified key issues on forest management such as active partnership with international forest cooperation, formulation of research-based policies, promotion of forest-based eco-tourism, mainstreaming of climate change mitigation and adaptation, strengthening of law enforcement, and intensify the research and development in sustainable forest management in the region.

The internship was a success which served as venue for the students to learn new knowledge and experience about sustainable forest management which will be helpful and applicable to their respective economies. APFNet scholarship students expressed their gratitude and thanks to the ECTF, APFNet, Universities and all the people involved.

Scholarship Students New Year Gala

On December 22nd, 2019, Dr. Lu De (Executive Director of APFNet) together with APFNet secretariat paid a visit to Nanjing Forestry University for New Year Gala. The event aimed to strengthen the cooperation between APFNet and Nanjing Forestry University for its scholarship program which was attended by professors, staffs, and scholarship students.

Nanjing Forestry University (NFU) has been the host for APFNet scholarship holders since 2014. To date, there are 33 students from 11 economies who completed their master's degrees. Currently, there are 28 students studying in the university of which two students are doing Ph.D. program and other under Master's degree program.

Dr. Zhu Jiangang (Dean of the College of International Education, NFU) welcomed the the APFNet Team. Dr. Zhu extend thanks to APFNet for its constant support to NFU as well as grateful for the strategic collaboration with APFNet in promoting forestry education. According to him PNG's forestry sector has contributed a lot to the country's economy by exporting wood products of which China is the huge market. That is why it is important to establish connection and cooperation between the two economies. Mr. Haron described his learning experience in Beijing Forestry University under APFNet Scholarship Program as unique learning experience that provided him the opportunity to participate to different international conferences, meetings and symposiums. Aside from that, it provided him the platform to communicate and exchange ideas from various people with the same profession on the sustainable forest management practices in Asia-Pacific.

However, Mr. Haron revealed that his study experience in Beijing Forestry University has upsides and downsides. The most benefit that he got was able to become more self-independent and he enjoyed meeting new friends from different cultural backgrounds.
